 - ► TT Rockstars and Sumdog all children will have logins stuck in to the front of their homework books.


Reading at home


Home reading journal:


- Expectation: Children will complete a short book review on a book that they have read. At least one entry should be made every 2 weeks (3 over the course of a half term). Book reviews should be signed off by a parent.
- Journals should come into school every Friday to be quickly checked by a teacher/LSA.
- Daily reading school issued books OR home books. Encourage children to read but can be read by or alongside an adult.


Must reads














Can be read in any order but some will support the topic in school.
