Autumn Term 2022


- Science, PE, Computing and Maths will tie in and link together through the study of Human Circulation and Movement.





YEAR 6 LEARNING FOCUS - OUT OF SCHOOL

What can you do at home to help?

'Little-and-often' is better and more balanced than completing all of the strands of work in one go (building good habits for secondary school)

- Weekly spellings (know it in context and practise daily).
- Talk around the vocabulary discussion homework with child to broaden word knowledge (in back of red homework book).
- Daily Reading fluency (15 minutes). It will be beneficial to talk around what your child has just read and ask them open questions based around what has happened. Relate to impressions of character that you get from the book...
- Maths fluency homework. TT Rockstars to build speed of recall in addition to tasks linked to current unit of maths.

WHAT DO WE NEED TO BRING TO SCHOOL?

- Homework BY the following Friday. If a child has not handed the homework in by the following Friday, then the child will stay in for a portion of the break time or lunch time to complete the homework as they will have missed out on the learning.
- Ring-bound 'My Homework Diary' to show what they are doing daily at home. We check and sign this weekly during our library time on a Friday pm.
- New Home Reading Journal (yellow book) every other Friday (dates were on here and we will tell the children which Friday it is too!)
- They can have one reading book from the library that stays at home so they can 'Active Read' and 'Busy Brain' read at home. Then, their second reading book from the library can stay in school so that they can 'Busy Brain' read after lunch. Having two books (a fiction and a non-fiction) gives breadth to them and for us to promote, 'Sticking with it.'
- Water bottle.
- Healthy, break-time snack.

YEAR 6 HOMEWORK ALLOCATION

- <u>A Grammar and a Reading</u> task every week to underpin current learning in class (in red homework book).
- <u>Spellings</u> learn the differentiated group of spellings given for the week. Children will learn these in class too and explore word families, the etymology of words and new vocabulary during their daily 20 minute SPaG sessions in the pm. Practise in red, homework book. Spellings given on a Friday and tested on the following Friday.
- <u>'Exploring and discussing vocabulary'</u> task with adults at home.
- <u>Maths</u> Number fluency tasks and reasoning questions (completed in red, homework book) related to current learning OR revisiting maths from the previous unit of learning to check understanding and retention of learning.

HOMEWORK LEARNING DIARY

- Home-School agreement
- Reading record Children read at least 15 minutes per day at home and record in their diary
- Record of regular learning (their time spent on each area)
- Home-School Communications add a note if easier than contacting the office.
- RE links and themes with weekly readings for children to reflect on at home.
