Teaching sequence:





Lesson 1 – Response to Reading

Read the story together. Do you like vegetables? Which are your favourite? Which vegetables does Grandpa grow in his garden? How does Grandpa change Oliver's views about vegetables?

Make a list of all the vegetables that Oliver discovers in Grandpa's garden. Label Grandpa's garden. Remove digraphs (two letters, one sound) from the words. Ask the children to add the missing sounds eg b_tr_t.



Lesson 2 – Vocabulary

Play 'Best of 3' to develop adjectives that best describe each vegetable. Ask children choose and record their favourite.


Ask the children to write simple noun phrases to describe all of the vegetables that Oliver finds, eg *the crunchy carrot*. Extend by asking children to write pairs of adjectives with a comma, eg *the leafy, green spinach*.



Lesson 3 – Exploring the writing

Reread the text. Write a list of the days of the week. Ask the children to match each vegetable that Oliver finds, to the correct day of the week.

M-o-n-d-ay T-ue-s-d-ay W-e-d-n-e-s-d-ay Th-ur-s-d-ay F-r-i-d-ay S-a-t-ur-d-ay S-u-n-d-ay



Don't forget Capital Letters for the days of the week!



Lesson 4 – Practice & Play

Play 'shades of meaning' – find synonyms for the verb 'ate' (to eat)

Rank the alternative verbs in order of 'intensity'.

Challenge children further to think of adverbs using the 'ly' suffix to describe how Oliver ate each vegetable:

Oliver devoured the leafy spinach <u>quickly</u>.

Oliver <u>carefully</u> swallowed the crunchy carrot.





Lesson 5 – Writing Challenge

Write a recount of Oliver's week with his grandparents. Which vegetables did he eat each day?

His recount could be sent in the form of a letter to his mum, or as a diary of his week.

On Monday I guzzled the crunchy carrot.

On Tuesday I devoured the leafy spinach.

On Wednesday I munched the tasty rhubarb.
