This story focuses on:

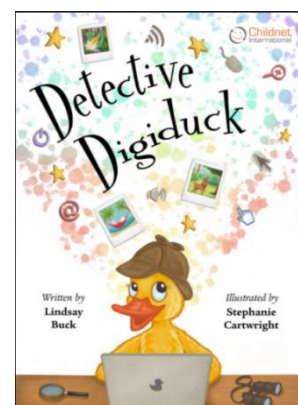
- Upsetting images
