<b>Week 2: Week beg. 27<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Understanding the World</b> – Plant a seed. Can you talk about the things that a seed needs to grow?	<b>Communication &amp; Language and Literacy</b> – Can you design a den? Make list of all you'll need to make your den. Then build your den! Get your grown ups to join in, can you tell them what they need to do to help you? Add pictures of your design and den to Tapestry.	<b>Managing feelings and behaviour</b> – During this uncertain time children may be experiencing different feelings. Make some feelings cards together and encourage your children to use them to talk about their feelings. Make a list of things that make them feel happy together and get your child to choose one if you see that they are struggling with their feelings.	<b>Physical development</b> – Help your grown-ups with hanging out the washing. Get your child to open the pegs to hang the washing on the line, this will help to strengthen their finger muscles to support writing.	<b>Maths</b> – Race to 20. Get your child to write a number line to 20, have one for each player. Take it in turns to roll a die and place that many counters/bits of pasta/buttons on your number line. But if you roll a 6, you need to remove the counters/bits of pasta/buttons and start again. The winner is the first one to get to 20! Ensure to check your child's number knowledge throughout the game!
