Week 4 – week beginning 11 th May 2020	Reading – Story time. Ensure that you make time each day to share a story together. Can your child share what they think the book will be about? Can your child anticipate what will happen next? After you've read the book together encourage your child to talk about the beginning, middle and end? Maybe they could make up their own ending?	Literacy - Can your child write their new ending to the story you have shared with them? <i>Remember your child must do this independently; they can use their sound mats and tricky words to help them.</i>	Maths – Ask a grown-up to help you make a paper aeroplane or use YouTube to help. Test them outside. Measure the distance of how far it has flown with your steps or with a tape measure. Which one goes the furthest?	Technology – Go on a technology hunt around your house. Draw all the different technology you have in your home. Can you tell us your favourite and how you use it? Upload a video to Tapestry.	Expressive Arts - Listen carefully to the music. https://youtu.be/oCUtOKsmOZ8 Can you spot when it gets loud and quiet? What might live in the aquarium? What else might you see? Could you create an aquarium in a bowl of water? How might the animals move around?
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Please upload your child's learning that they do each week to Tapestry.

Children must participate in the literacy, maths and phonics learning every week.

As the children are not in school at the moment it is helpful for the teachers to see what your child is achieving at home. When you upload your child's learning to Tapestry it continues their learning journey, helping us and you see the progress that your child is making.
